- 1 of only 2 public Montessori adolescent schools with a farm



- \Box Identity: social power / social hierarchy social justice / helping society
- o being an adult (having a role in community/society)
- □ the arts (music, drama, visual) being human
- intimate relationships
- economic independence

Montessori Adolescent Theory



- Experience main mechanism of society, that of production and exchange
- Learn academically and through experience in elements of social life.
- To teach details is to bring confusion; to establish the relationship between things is to bring knowledge

In Practice

- Open, thinking, challenging
 - No answers
 - Interdisciplinary
- "Unsupervised" at times
 - "Help me do it by myself"
- Diverse community, where diversity is valued
 - Actively working to create peace through social change.
- Social learning environment
